This privacy statement provides information about the processing and the protection of your personal data.

Processing operation: Europe Day 2021

Data Controller: European Commission

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1. Introduction

The European Commission (hereafter 'the Commission') is committed to protecting your personal data and to respecting your privacy. The Commission collects and further processes personal data pursuant to Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 23 October 2018 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data by the Union institutions, bodies, offices and agencies and on the free movement of such data (repealing Regulation (EC) No 45/2001).

This privacy statement explains the reasons for the processing of your personal data, the way we collect, handle and ensure protection of all personal data provided, how that information is used and what rights you have in relation to your personal data. It also specifies the contact details of the responsible Data Controller with whom you may exercise your rights, the Data Protection Officer and the European Data Protection Supervisor.

The information in relation to the activities organised within a framework of the Europe Day 2021 undertaken by the European Commission Representation in Copenhagen is presented below.

2. Why and how do we process your personal data?

<u>The purpose of the processing</u> is to facilitate the management of activities organised within a framework of the Europe Day 2021.

More specifically, personal data may be collected for:

 communication activities such as taking pictures and promoting EC corporate communication campaigns.

The photographs of participants and organisers will be taken and published in the context of the Europe Day 2021 on the official website of the E.C Representation in Denmark. Participants who do not wish to be photographed have the possibility to object to processing (see Section 7).

Your personal data will not be used for automated decision-making including profiling.

3. On what legal ground(s) do we process your personal data?

We process your personal data, because you have given <u>consent</u> to the processing your personal data for one or more specific purposes (Article 5(1)(d) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725).

For specific processing activities, the consent of the data subject is necessary. In compliance with Article 3(15) and Article 7 of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725, the consent must be freely given, specific, informed and unambiguous and it may be expressed by an email, submitted e-registration form, or in any other written form.

We need your consent for:

taking pictures

We have obtained your consent directly from you, via authorisation form.

4. Which personal data do we collect and further process?

In order to carry out this processing operation, we may collect the following categories of personal data:

- name and surname
- email address
- postal address

5. How long do we keep your personal data?

We only keep your personal data for the time necessary to fulfil the purpose of collection or further processing.

5.1. Personal data necessary for management of activities organised within a framework of the Europe Day 2021

Personal data provided for the participation in the initiative will be stored for a maximum period of 1 (one) year after the end of the Europe Day 2021.

6. How do we protect and safeguard your personal data?

All personal data in electronic format (e-mails, documents, databases, uploaded batches of data, etc.) are stored either on the servers of the European Commission (located on the premises of the Directorate-General in Brussels and in the DGDIGIT datacentre in Luxembourg), or of its contractors, all inside the EU. All processing operations are carried out pursuant to the <u>Commission Decision (EU, Euratom) 2017/46</u> of 10 January 2017 on the security of communication and information systems in the European Commission.

The Commission's contractors are bound by a specific contractual clause for any processing operations of personal data on behalf of the Commission, and by the confidentiality obligations deriving from the <u>Regulation (EU) 2016/679</u> of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data (GDPR).

In order to protect your personal data, the Commission has put in place a number of technical and organisational measures. Technical measures include appropriate actions to address online security, risk of data loss, alteration of data or unauthorised access, taking into consideration the risk presented by the processing and the nature of the personal data being processed. Organisational measures include restricting access to personal data solely to authorised persons with a legitimate need to know for the purposes of this processing operation.

7. Who has access to your personal data and to whom is it disclosed?

Access to your personal data is provided to the authorised personnel of the EU institutions and its contractors responsible for carrying out this processing operation according to the "need to know" principle. Such staff abide by statutory, and when required, additional confidentiality agreements.

Authorised staff the Commission have access to the personal data provided by the participants to the Europe Day 2021 and related paper and electronic files containing

information related to day-to-day correspondence. The data is necessary for the organisation and management of follow-up activities.

Authorised staff of the Commission processors and external contractors may be provided with the data relevant for them to provide the required logistical and organisational support.

The information we collect will not be given to any third party, except to the extent and for the purpose we may be required to do so by law.

6.1. Social media

We may use social media to inform about and promote the Europe Day 2021. For detailed information about the use of social media by the European Commission, see the Record of Processing DPR-EC-00073 (Social Media Use by the European Commission).

We recommend that users carefully read the relevant privacy policies of the social media tools used. These explain each company's policy of personal data collection and further processing, their use of data, users' rights and the ways in which users can protect their privacy when using those services.

The use of a third party IT tool does not in any way imply that the European Commission endorses them or their privacy policies. In the event that one or more third party IT tools are occasionally unavailable, we accept no responsibility for lack of service due to their downtime.

8. What are your rights and how can you exercise them?

You have specific rights as a 'data subject' under Chapter III (Articles 14-25) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725. As regards this processing operation, you can exercise the following rights:

- the right to access your personal data (Article 17 of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725);
- the right to rectification in the case that your personal data is inaccurate or incomplete (Article 18 of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725);
- the right to erasure of your personal data (Article 19 of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725);
- where applicable, the right to restrict the processing of your personal data (Article 20 of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725);
- the right to data portability (Article 22 of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725);
- the right to object to the processing of your personal data, which is lawfully carried out pursuant to Article 5(1)(a) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 on grounds relating to your particular situation.

If you have provided your consent for the present processing operation, you can withdraw it at any time by notifying the Data Controller. The withdrawal will not affect the lawfulness of the processing carried out before you have withdrawn your consent.

You can exercise your rights by contacting the Data Controller, or in case of conflict the Data Protection Officer. If necessary, you can also address the European Data Protection Supervisor. Their contact information is given under Section 9.
